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1. <u>TITLE</u>

Purchase of CISCO Network Switches for New BEX IV
Schools Opening Summer 2017For Introduction:April 5, 2017For Action:April 19, 2017

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

The purpose of this Board action is to approve the combined CISCO Network Switch purchase for the new Building Excellence (BEX) IV Levy Schools opening summer 2017.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to execute purchase orders through Proposal # IC-WA001-042516-1 with Ednetics, Inc. for a total not to exceed (NTE) \$462,163.60, plus Washington State Sales Tax, over fiscal years 2016/2017, in the form of the four draft purchase orders attached to the Board Action Report, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement the purchase orders.

4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

a. **Background** These newly built and remodeled schools will need to have network equipment to provide the needed local area network connections for all wired and wireless connections for the internet and district-wide access. In addition, this will provide the district with the connections for the telephone systems, security cameras, and environmental monitoring.

In the past, the District purchased technology equipment on a per-school basis. In the fall of 2016, staff developed a new process to aggregate these purchases.

This consistency of network infrastructure in the schools supports the same management as all of the other schools.

The competitively bid procurement process through E-Rate will be eligible for up to 60% reimbursement once purchase is complete. The application has been approved by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) who administers the E-Rate program.

- b. Alternatives Do not approve this motion. This is not recommended because these new schools will be without technology for staff or student use beginning in the 2017-2018 school year. This does not align with the Strategic Plan of the district.
- c. **Research** On April 25, 2016, USAC FRN#1699123631 was published to the public, which secured pricing for the purchase. Cisco networking products are the current District Standard deployed in our school's local area networks. Department of Technology Services (DoTS) has conducted a previous bidding process to determine the best alternative for supporting the needs of the district regarding technology.

5. <u>FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE</u>

The fiscal impact to this action will be the one-time cost for the purchase of network equipment for a total not to exceed \$462,163.60 plus tax.

In February 2013, 72% of Seattle voters approved and supported the BEX IV Capital levy. This levy was the culmination of an eighteen-month long process analyzing the facilities needs of the District and supports the District's long-range plans to upgrade and renovate aging school facilities. The process included countless hours of planning, coordinating efforts throughout the district, community engagement, and feedback, extensive Seattle School Board guidance, and input that lead to a unanimous Seattle School Board vote in November 2012 that approved the BEX IV projects list.

This action did not undergo a specific equity analysis. The selection of projects in the Building, Technology and Academics (BTA) and BEX levy programs were designed to provide equitable access to schools across the city.
