1. TITLE

For Action:

Approval of contracts for Sign Language Interpreter Vendors RFQ 11641

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

This Board Action Report seeks approval for annual contracts generated from agencies/providers approved through RFQ 11641, Sign Language Interpreter Vendors, for a not-to-exceed total amount of \$500,000 for the 2019-20 school year, based on yearly 2018-19 Sign Language Interpreter Contract Totals.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to execute contracts with agencies approved through RFQ 11641, Sign Language Interpreter Vendors, based on an average Interpreter hourly rate of \$73.50 per hour, for a not-to-exceed total amount of \$500,000 for all agencies governed under the RFQ, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement these contracts.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

a. **Background** There are currently Seattle Public Schools students with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) that require special education services that the district will be unable to provide as we are not fully staffed with appropriate Interpreter staff.

This motion is being brought because of requirements around the provision of student IEP services, and is based on historical data trends that indicate the need for additional contracted staffing support for sign language interpreters at the beginning of the school year and throughout the school year to address unfilled positions and leave replacement positions as well as to cover absences.

The district is currently evaluating the specific needs for the 2019-20 school year. This contract authority is being requested now to allow for sufficient time to implement the contracts. The estimated amount is based on 2018-19 totals. One agency served 3 students, and another served 3 students per day.

- b. Alternatives Not to approve this motion. This is not recommended because the students' legally mandated Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) will not be met without appropriate staffing. The district does not currently have enough additional staff or substitutes to provide sign language interpretation when positions go unfilled or for leave replacements.

Fiscal impact to this action is estimated at this time to be up to \$500,000.

Community engagement was elicited through the RFQ process for Sign Language Interpreters. Through the RFQ process, feedback and responses to questions generated by representatives from Seattle Public Schools were elicited from the agencies who submitted. The RFQ process allowed the district to review and determine that these agencies met the qualifications outlined through the RFQ. The Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DHH) Supervisor provided input to determine appropriate services in these areas and informed the RFQ process, as well as the need for ongoing agency contracts to fill positions and provide leave replacement coverage.

7. EQUITY ANALYSIS

Sign language interpreters are required IEP driven services. In review of the district's equity tool, an equity analysis was not appropriate for these services. This item was not taken through the Racial Equity Analysis Tool.

IEP teams have made highly specialized recommendations for these students based on their individualized needs, which includes parents/guardians. Special Education supervisors or

program specialists attend these IEP meetings and provide guidance. They provide district level oversight of placement and Least Restrictive Environment considerations.

8. <u>STUDENT BENEFIT</u>

Approval of this proposed action will benefit a student who requires IEP services, who would otherwise be inappropriately served or unable to access necessary special education services and supports to make adequate progress in their educational programming.
