## **1. TITLE**

BTA III/BEX IV: Resolution 2018/19-13, Final Acceptance of Contract K5069 with CDK Construction Services, Inc., for the Seismic Upgrades at Salmon Bay K-8 at Monroe School and the Decatur School project

## **2. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this action is to approve final acceptance of Contract K5069 with CDK Construction Services, Inc., for the Seismic Upgrades at Salmon Bay K-8 at Monroe School and the Decatur School project. Board approval allows the district to submit required documents to the State of Washington Department of Labor & Industries, Department of Revenue and Employment Security Department and close out the project, including authorizing the release of project retainage.

## **3. RECOMMENDED MOTION**

I move that the School Board adopt Resolution 2018/19-13 and accept the work performed under Contract K5069 with CDK Construction Services, Inc., for the Seismic Upgrades at Salmon Bay K-8 at Monroe School and the Decatur School project as final.

## **4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

### **a. Background**

- The Seismic Upgrades at Salmon Bay K-8 at Monroe School and the Decatur School project refers to work performed at Salmon Bay K-8 at Monroe School, located at 1810 NW 65th St., Seattle, WA 98117, and Decatur School, located at 7711 43rd Ave NE, Seattle, WA 98115. The project originated from the Meng Building Conditions Report issued in April 2009. Salmon Bay K-8 at Monroe School was included on the BTA III capital levy and Decatur School was included on the BEX IV capital levy. The overall goal of these seismic improvements was to increase the stability of the overall facilities by reinforcement of existing structure and, in select areas, replacement of the existing structural components. All priority 1 elements or systems identified for Salmon Bay K-8 at Monroe School and the Decatur School project in the 2012 expanded analysis of seismic building data have been completed.

- The A/E design team headed by Harthorne Hagen Architects was selected as a result of submittals received for RFP 04572. The construction project was publicly bid as Bid No. B11538 on March 30, 2016, with a total of four (4) bids being received. CDK Construction Services, Inc. was deemed to be the low bid contractor, and Harthorne Hagen Architects recommended acceptance of the bid.
- CDK Construction Services, Inc. satisfactorily completed the contract work, with an accepted bid of \$1,353,814 and incurring a total of \$146,151 in change orders over the course three (3) project phases at two (2) different site locations.

**b. Alternatives**

Not accepting the project in a timely manner could put the district in a position subject to litigation. Therefore, this alternative is not recommended.

**5. FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE**

All payments have been made to the contractor from the BTA III/BEX IV Capital levy funds. No outstanding invoices remain.

During the course of the project, four (4) Change Orders were issued, comprised of eighteen (18) Change Order Proposals or Construction Change Directives. Change Orders totaled \$146,151 plus WSST. Change order expenditures totaled approximately 10.8% of the construction contract amount with the most significant expenditures associated with owner-directed changes such as restoration of plaster detailing at the main entry lobby where a seismic brace wall was constructed, relocation of existing lockers for a more efficient layout, and installation of cable tray for data cabling at the main corridor.
