1. TITLE

BEX IV: Approval of Budget Transfer and Award Contract P5132, Bid No. B012042, to CDK Construction Services, Inc., for the Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project

2. **PURPOSE**

This motion would approve a one-time fund transfer in the amount of \$53,871 from the BEX IV Program Contingency and authorize the Superintendent to enter into a construction contract in the amount of \$1,560,000, plus Washington State Sales Tax, for the Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project.

3. **RECOMMENDED MOTION**

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to:

1. Implement a budget transfer in the amount of \$53,871, from the BEX IV Program Contingency to the Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvement project; and,

2. Execute construction contract P5132 with CDK Construction Services, Inc., in the amount of \$1,560,000, plus Washington State Sales Tax, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement the contract.

4. **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

a) Background

Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project, located at 9201 15th Avenue NW, Seattle, WA 98117, is funded through the BEX IV levy passed by the voters in February 2013.

The Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project was publicly bid May 6, 2020, with a total of 7 bid(s) being received. The scope of work for this project is to seismically improve the school and requires selective demolition, patching and repair of existing walls, ceilings, floors, and finishes with minor modifications to mechanical, plumbing, fire alarm, and electrical systems.

This motion allows the transfer of \$53,871 funds from the BEX IV Program Contingency to the Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project budget. The transfer will adjust the original Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project budget of \$2,577,588 to the current estimated total project budget of \$2,631,459.

This motion allows the district to execute a construction contract with CDK Construction Services, Inc., who was the low responsive, responsible bidder.

Whitman Middle School was constructed in 1959. Prior improvements constructed at the school since 2000 include: science classroom, interior, ADA, mechanical and electrical upgrades in 2009; and athletic field improvements in 2018. Athletic field lighting improvements are proposed to be implemented in 2020.

b) Alternatives

Deny Motion. If motion is denied, the district will not be able to execute the contract to start the design of the Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project. This is not recommended because it would negatively impact the district's commitment to complete the seismic work that the voters approved in regard to the BEX IV Capital Levy.

The fiscal impact to this motion will transfer \$53,871 from the BEX IV Program Contingency to the Whitman Middle School Seismic Improvements project budget and award Construction Contract P5132 to CDK Construction Services, Inc., in the amount of \$1,560,000, plus Washington State sales tax. The revenue source for this motion is from the BEX IV Capital Levy.

The selection of projects in the BEX IV program went through an extensive community vetting process and ultimately received 72% approval from voters in February 2013.

7. <u>EQUITY ANALYSIS</u>

The selection of projects in the BEX IV Capital Levy program was done during 2012 and the selection process did not go through an equity analysis. Projects were identified to either address student enrollment/capacity issues, buildings reaching the end of their useful life (lifecycle) or to address life-safety or operational issues.

Public works projects follow bidding requirements outlined in RCW 28A.335.190 with notice by publication given in at least one newspaper of general circulation, the Daily Journal of Commerce, for a period of two weeks and outreach to the National Association of Minority Contractors referencing the District website concerning projects bidding to increase Minority and Woman Business Enterprise participation.

8. <u>STUDENT BENEFIT</u>

It is the goal of the district to continue the process of implementing the BTA and BEX Capital Levy programs and provide students with safe and secure school buildings.
