1. <u>TITLE</u>

BEX V: Resolution 2020/21- 8 New-in-Lieu Replacement Option for the Van Asselt School Addition project

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

School Board Approval of Resolution 2020/21- 8 is required by the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 392-347-042 as part of the Form D-3 approval process to receive state funding assistance for the Building Excellence (BEX) V Program for the Van Asselt School Addition project.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board approve Resolution 2020/21- 8 as attached to the Board Action Report, certifying that a portion of the new facility identified in the project application (Form D-3) for the Van Asselt School Addition project submitted to the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction will be built in lieu of modernizing a portion of the existing facilities, and that that portion of the existing facility will be demolished.

4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

a. Background

The current design of the Van Asselt School Addition located at 7201 Beacon Ave. S., Seattle, WA 98108, requires demolition of the 1940's addition to the existing 1909 City of Seattle Historic Landmark buildings and replacement with new construction in lieu of modernization. The replacement is primarily due to major deficiencies with the existing building, as well as to provide space for the Addition.

b. Alternatives

Do not approve the Van Asselt School Addition New Construction-In-Lieu- of Modernization Resolution. This is not recommended. If the state assistance funding requirements are not met, the district will not receive the state assistance funding for this project.

5. <u>FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE</u>

The Van Asselt School Addition project funding sources are from the BEX V Capital Levy, and anticipated state assistance funding.

If this Resolution is not approved in a timely manner, the state funding assistance for the Van Asselt School Addition project will not be forthcoming. This Resolution is a requirement of the State D-3 Application for Assistance. The Van Asselt School Addition is anticipated to receive up to \$258,000 in School Construction Assistance Program (SCAP) funding for the new-in-lieu construction.

The selection of projects in the BEX V program went through an extensive community engagement. The community involvement in the Van Asselt School Addition project is following the Community Outreach Plan published in the BEX V monthly report.

Projects identified for inclusion in the BEX V levy will ultimately improve conditions for all students in the affected schools. Improved building conditions create a better

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Seattle School District No. 1, King County, Seattle, Washington certifying that new facilities/additions to facilities identified in the project application (Form D-3) submitted to the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction will be built in lieu of modernizing existing facilities, and that the existing facilities will be demolished.

WHEREAS, the Seattle School District has undertaken a project to construct a new addition to Van Asselt School; and

WHEREAS, both local and state funds will be used for this project; and

WHEREAS, there are laws and rules regarding District eligibility for state assistance; and it is required that the District certify per WAC 392-347-042 that the existing facility or space to be replaced will not be used for instructional purposes after the new construction is completed, and that the existing facility will be demolished.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Seattle School Board of Directors certifies the Van Asselt Addition project will include demolishing portions of the existing structure consisting of approximately 4,820 square feet that will be replaced by a new facility of approximately 50,000 square feet.
