1. TITLE

BEX V, School Construction Assistance Program (SCAP): Award Construction Contract P5180, Bid No. B102029, to _____ for the Kimball Elementary School Replacement - Phase II

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

The purpose of this action is to provide authorization for the Superintendent to enter into a construction contract in the amount of \$_____(cost range \$54,000,000-\$55,000,000), including base bid plus Alternates #__, plus Washington State sales tax, for the Kimball Elementary School Replacement - Phase II project.

3. RECOMMENDED MOTION

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to execute construction contract P5180 with _____ in the amount of \$____ (cost range \$54,000,000-\$55,000,000), including base bid plus Alternates #___, plus Washington State sales tax, with any minor additions, deletions, modifications and actions deemed necessary by the Superintendent to implement the contract.

4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

a. Background

The Kimball Elementary School Replacement – Phase II project, located at 3200 23rd Ave S, Seattle, WA 98144, is funded through the Building Excellence V (BEX V) Capital Levy passed by the voters in February 2019. Completion of this project is scheduled for August 2023 prior to commencement of the 2023/24 school year.

The Kimball Elementary School Replacement – Phase II was publicly bid on July 27, 2021, and a total of ____ contractors submitted bids. The scope of work for this project includes the construction of a new K-5 school for 650 students to replace the existing school on the same site. Kimball Elementary School Replacement Phase I – Demolition expected substantial completion is September 3, 2021.

The new school incorporates passive design principles that will minimize energy consumption and the eliminate use of fossil fuels consistent with Board Resolution No. 2020/21-18, committing to transitioning the District to 100% clean, renewable energy

with the goal of improving student health and the creation of more sustainable and equitable communities, passed by the Board earlier this year.

On September 23, 2020, the board adopted the Student and Community Workforce Agreement (SCWA) on projects with anticipated project budgets in excess of \$5,000,000. The requirements of the SCWA were included as part of the contract documents for this project.

This motion allows the district to execute a construction contract with _____, who was the low responsive, responsible bidder.

b. Alternatives

Deny Motion. If motion is denied, the district will not be able to execute the contract to construct the Kimball Elementary School Replacement – Phase II project. This is not recommended because it would negatively impact the district's commitment to provide equitable access in our schools.

The selection of projects in the BEX V program went through an extensive community vetting process and ultimately received 68.19% approval from voters in February 2019

Projects identified for inclusion in the BEX V Capital Levy will ultimately improve conditions for all students in the affected schools. Improved building conditions create a better environment for learning and can provide facilities to better position students for academic success.
