BTA IV: Approval of Budget Increase for the Ballard, Garfield and West Seattle High Schools Roof For Action: February 1, 2017

2. PURPOSE

The purpose of this action is to approve a budget increase for the Ballard, Garfield and West Seattle High Schools Roof Replacement projects, in order to execute required work for a complete and maintenance free long-term solution.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board approve a one-time fund transfer from the BTA IV Program Contingency for the Ballard, Garfield and West Seattle High Schools Roof Replacement projects in the amount of \$6,545,000.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

a. **Background**

On February 9, 2016, voters approved passage of a \$475.3 million BTA IV Capital Levy. This capital levy continues the financing of small and large infrastructure projects to be implemented over a six-year period (2017 through 2023). Roof replacement projects were identified at Ballard, Garfield and West Seattle High Schools as part of the BTA IV levy.

The initial scope of these projects included replacement and/or repairs to all or a portion of the existing roof at each site as described below. In addition, selected architect and envelope consultants were to implement further investigation to determine the extent of possible moisture intrusion pathways, water damage, and detail needed repairs. During the course of their investigation, additional problems were identified at each school and Capital Projects is recommending these be addressed to ensure all moisture intrusion problems are resolved.

At Ballard High School the BTA IV Capital Levy included the replacement of the entire single-ply roof assembly. During the investigation it was learned that the Gymnasium steep slope standing seam metal roof was in poor condition as it is inappropriately fastened and needs to be removed and correctly attached to prevent water intrusion. In addition, the sheet metal wall panel cladding system has no weather resistant barrier as required by code and must be removed, substrate repaired and then reattached to prevent further water intrusion into the building. Project budget adjustment increase request totals \$4,660,000 and includes additional construction costs, construction contingency costs, design fees and permit fees.



At Garfield High School the BTA IV Capital Levy included the replacement of the northern portion of the roof over the historic portion of the building. During the investigation it was learned that there were numerous penetrations in the roof that needed to be removed and infilled, the existing skylights need to be replaced and non-typical fluid applied flashing membrane needs to be utilized at the existing terra cotta to satisfy the Landmarks Board. (This request by the Landmarks Board for the non-typical fluid applied flashing adds \$30,000 to the cost of the project.) Project budget adjustment increase request totals \$260,000 and includes additional construction costs, construction contingency costs, design fees and permit fees.

At West Seattle High School the BTA IV Capital Levy included the repair of the north facing historic clay tile roof. During the investigation it was learned that there were numerous problems with the south facing historic clay tile roofs, central ridge walkway, the cupolas and the existing skylight. In addition, it was determined to revise the historic tile installation attachment (batten/counter-batten system) to minimize the amount of penetrations through the subroofing system and enhancing moisture migration and air flow. Lastly, scaffolding has been recommended to be installed around the building perimeter where work is occurring to allow roof access and enhance worker and building occupant safety. Project budget adjustment increase request totals \$1,625,000 and includes additional construction costs, construction contingency costs, design fees and permit fees.

b. Alternatives

Do not approve the project budget adjustment. If motion is denied, the risk to the district would impact success in preventing moisture intrusion into the building. Each site was identified as it had significant roof leak problems that pose a health risk to building occupants and further consequential damages to building structure and architectural finishes. Continued deterioration would lead to greater annual maintenance costs and further magnify the scope of work and associated costs to implement repairs.
