1. TITLE

OSPI Distressed Schools Grant: Award Architectural and Engineering Services Contract P1579, to Mahlum Architects, Inc., for the Magnolia Elementary School Phase II Classroom Addition Project

2. PURPOSE

This Board Action Report approves the contract for architectural and engineering services for the Magnolia Elementary School Phase II Classroom Addition project. Per Board Policy No. 6220, Procurement, all contracts exceeding \$250,000 must be approved by the Board. The contract for the full scope of Architectural and Engineering Services for the Magnolia Elementary School Phase II Classroom Addition project exceeds \$250,000.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to execute a contract with Mahlum Architects for the Magnolia Elementary School Phase II classroom Addition project, in the amount of Five Hundred Forty Three Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty Eight Dollars (\$543,938), plus Reimbursable Expenses not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000), with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement the contract.

4. <u>BACKGROUND INFORMATION</u>

a. Background

During the design of the Magnolia Elementary School Renovation and Addition project, which is still under construction, a master plan was developed that would allow the school to expand at a future date to house a 500-student elementary school that meets K-3 class size reduction goals. Due to current construction market conditions, it was not fiscally feasible to design and construct the Master Plan for Magnolia Elementary School. Consistent with the BTA levy language the project was designed to meet the educational specifications for a 500-student school prior to K-3 class size reductions with provisions to accommodate a future six-classroom expansion if and when funding became available.

SPS subsequently applied for and received a distressed school grant in the amount of \$4,300,000 to design and construct the six additional classrooms. The District advertised

for architects and Mahlum Architects was selected as they had designed the master plan and Phase 1 improvements at the school. Washington State law requires the most qualified architect be selected to design the project. The maximum allowable construction costs (MACC) for the project is \$2,817,750.

b. Alternatives

Do not execute the contract. This is not recommended. If the contract is not executed, Magnolia Elementary School may remain out of compliance with the class size goals.

c. Research

The architect will employ the following resources when planning and beginning design of this project:

- Landmarks Preservation Board Certificate of Approval
