For Action:

Approval of agreements with Seattle Children's Hospital and Fred Hutchison Cancer Research Center for Hospital-Based Educational Services

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

This Board Action Report proposes a motion to approve contracts with Seattle Children's and Fred Hutchinson to provide Hospital-Based Education Services.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to enter into agreements with Seattle Children's Hospital and Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center to allow for flow-through of OSPI Hospital Based Instruction funds for the 2017-2018 school year in the following amounts: Seattle Children's Hospital in the amount of \$465,500, and Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in the amount of \$10,000, in the form of the draft agreements attached to the Board Action Report, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement the agreements.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- a. **Background** Seattle Children's Hospital and Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center (FHCRC) provide Hospital based instruction in the form of tutoring as supported by Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) funds. Seattle Public Schools is the flow-through agency by which Seattle Children's Hospital and Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center shall access such OSPI funds. Seattle Public Schools does not place students at Seattle Children's Hospital or Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center; students are medically placed. As the flow-through agency, Seattle Public Schools only processes the education payments and reports yearly to OSPI. Enrollment fluctuates based on when students are medically placed and discharged. Seattle Children's Hospital employs 5.4 FTE certified teachers and 2.1 FTE instructional aides utilizing these funds to provide hospital based instruction. Fred Hutchison Cancer Research Center provides services to an average of 3 students monthly utilizing these funds.
- b. Alternatives There are no alternative services that Seattle Public Schools can provide to meet this need these are required services for hospital-based instruction and are mandated by state law.

Fiscal impact to this action will be the contract expenditure of \$475,500, which the District receives from OSPI, as a pass-through agent, for this purpose.
