1. <u>TITLE</u>

BTA III and BEX IV: Final Acceptance of Contract K5064 with Bate's Roofing, LLC, for the Leschi Elementary School Reroof project

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

Board action is required to approve final acceptance of Contract K5064 with Bate's Roofing, LLC, for the Leschi Elementary School Reroof Project. Board approval allows the district to submit required documents to the State of Washington and closeout the project, including authorizing the release of project retainage.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board accept the work performed under Contract K5064 with Bate's Roofing, LLC, for the Leschi Elementary School Reroof Project as final.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

a. Background

This project was funded by BTA III and BEX IV Capital Levy funds. The project involved replacement of the aging roofing systems at the school. Other related minor modifications were also performed.

Miller Hayashi Architects designed the project. The district sought bids to reroof the school in the spring of 2016 and Bate's Roofing LLC was awarded the project for a contract amount of \$1,065,150 plus Washington State Sales Tax (WSST). The scope of work included removal of the aging roofing materials, installation of new roof insulation and plywood sheathing diaphragm, and installation of new roofing and sheet metal flashing and downspouts at the existing Leschi Elementary School. The work was completed in December, 2016.

Bate's Roofing LLC has satisfactorily completed the contract work and the consulting architect, Miller Hayashi Architects, agrees and recommends Board final acceptance of the project.

In accordance with WAC 392-344-160 Board approval of final acceptance is required to

release project retainage.

b. Alternatives

Not accepting the project in a timely manner could put the district in a position subject to litigation. Therefore, this alternative is not recommended.

5. <u>FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE</u>

All payments have been made to the contract from the Building Excellence (BEX) IV and Buildings, Technology and Academics (BTA) III Capital levy funds. No outstanding invoices remain.

During the course of the project two Change Orders were issued. Change Orders totaled \$26,569 plus WSST. Change order expenditures totaled 2.5% of the construction contract amount with the most significant expenditures associated with additional shingle nailing to achieve the 140 mph high wind warranty. Change orders were reasonable for a project of this magnitude.
