1. <u>TITLE</u>

Distressed School Grant Award Architectural & Engineering Contract P1692 to Studio Meng Strazzara Architecture for the Madison Middle School Eight Classroom Addition project

2. <u>PURPOSE</u>

The purpose of this action is to provide authorization for the Superintendent to enter into an Architectural & Engineering (A/E) contract in the amount of \$910,909.

3. <u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>

I move that the School Board authorize the Superintendent to execute A/E contract P1692 with Studio Meng Strazzara Architecture in the amount of \$895,909, plus reimbursable expenses of \$15,000 for architectural and engineering services. The total contract amount of \$910,909 is for the Madison Middle School Eight Classroom Addition Distressed School Grant project, with any minor additions, deletions, and modifications deemed necessary by the Superintendent, and to take any necessary actions to implement the contract.

4. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

a. Background

The Madison Middle School Eight Classroom Addition project, located at 3429 45th Ave. SW, Seattle, WA 98116 is funded through an Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) Distressed School Grant awarded for the 2019-2021 biennium.

The project scope includes the design and construction of a new eight classroom building addition on the existing 7.92 acre site. The project will relieve overcrowding at the school and the existing portables will be removed. The new school addition will meet the requirements outlined in the district's middle school educational specifications.

The firm of Studio Meng Strazzara Architecture was selected through the Architecture and Engineering (A/E) selection procedures established in Superintendent Procedure 6220SP.C. Six (6) firms submitted their qualifications and four (4) firms were shortlisted and interviewed, Bassetti Architects, BLRB Architects, TCF Architecture, and Studio Meng Strazzara were interviewed. Studio Meng Strazzara Architecture was judged to be the most qualified to provide these design services.

Prior improvements that have been made at Madison Middle School since the year 2000 include the 2004 remodel and building addition, and the 2016 CCTV upgrades.

5. <u>FISCAL IMPACT/REVENUE SOURCE</u>

The fiscal impact to this motion will be \$910,909. The revenue source for this motion is funded by the \$10,500,000 Distressed School grant from the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). The advertised Maximum Allowable Construction Cost budget is \$6,500,000, the total project budget is \$10,500,000 of which the AE contract is one part.

The selection of projects in the BEX V Levy program went through an extensive community vetting process and ultimately received 73% approval from voters in February 2019. This project was not selected to be part of the BEX V Levy, but it was part of the community vetting process for selecting BEX V projects.

7. <u>EQUITY ANALYSIS</u>

The selection of projects for consideration for the Distressed Schools Grant program was related to projected capacity concerns for the James Madison Middle School community. As such, this motion was not put through the equity analysis as would be done as part of the district's current capital planning efforts.

8. <u>STUDENT BENEFIT</u>

It is the goal of the district to continue the process of implementing Distressed School Grant and BTA and BEX Capital Levy programs and provide students with safe and secure school buildings.
