Native American Education Overview and Update Native American Education Program January 3, 2018

Native American Students:

- Seattle has about 2910 self-identified Native American students, however, we must call all the
 families that are Hispanic to determine if they are from a federally enrolled tribe and if they are
 Native American/Alaskan Native. If they are not we then have to manually remove them from
 this list, once this is achieved we will send the list to Department of Technology and they will
 remove them from the Native American/Alaskan Native list. We suspect the number will be
 somewhere around 1,200-1500.
- Students are distributed widely across the district.

Funding:

• Native Education receives funding from Title VI, Title III, The City of Seattle Human Services Department, district funds and other sources.

Native Education Updates

Student Supports:

- **After-school programs.** We are currently at Highland Park Elementary and Sandpoint Elementary.
- Increased Partnerships. We developed partnerships with the Seattle Parks and Rec, Native American Youth Academy Leadership Academy (NAYLA) high school students meet with many Title VI and tribal school students in the Puget Sound area at Chief Leschi Tribal School, University of Washington student tours and recruitment, Native American Education High School credit retrieval
- **Increased Teaching.** Funding has been set aside for a Native American Leadership Class. Students at Chief Sealth International High School

Native Curriculum Teaching Resources:

- **Since Time Immemorial,** the state mandated Native American curriculum is now available to all our teachers. This curriculum teaches Washington's tribal history, culture and government. We held a training October 13, 2017, we will have another training in partnership with the Visual Arts Department on January 27, 2018, and a third in spring 2018.
- Native Library. Huchoosedah has catalogued the district collection of Native American materials (student and teacher material)
