

Enrollment News


School Enrollment



From 2019-20 to 2020-21, district enrollment has dropped by 1,246 students (a 2.3% drop).


Enrollment in the district has fallen in the 2020-21 school year as a result of COVID-19. The largest drop in enrollment occurred after the announcement to continue remote learning in Fall 2020. Districts across the country have experienced similar declines in enrollment.

Percent Change in Enrollment by Grade (2019-20 to 2020-21)



In our district, enrollment decreases have been limited to K-5, while Middle and High School enrollment has grown slightly. Kindergarten had the largest percent drop in enrollment from last year.

Although most service areas saw a decrease in the number of student residents this year, Washington and Mercer continue to grow.

Capacity Relief Engagement

Although 2020 enrollment numbers have been tracking lower than projected due to COVID-19 and online learning, the district does not expect this drop in enrollment to be a new trend. It is anticipated that enrollment numbers will continue to match closely with previous projections.

As a result, Enrollment Planning has continued with capacity relief work so that the district is prepared for the return of in-person teaching. The district has begun engaging with communities to explore capacity relief methods in areas where students experience overcrowding.

Seattle Housing

Seattle Housing Authority Partnership

In the last few months, Seattle Public Schools and the Seattle Housing Authority have updated our Data Sharing Agreement and have shared data to ensure that students that are the furthest from educational justice have access to the services they need. View the Seattle Housing Authority Website

New Housing:

Yesler Family Housing, Estimated Completion in 2021 Impacted Schools: Bailey Gatzert Elementary, Washington Middle School, and Garfield High School

Seattle Housing Authority (SHA), Seattle Chinatown International District Preservation and Development Authority (SCIDpda), and Capitol Hill Housing (CHH) will be developing 158 units of affordable homes in and around the communities of Yesler Terrace, Little Saigon, and the Central district. This development is expected to include around 100 two or more bedroom units. More information can be found on the SCIDpda website.

North Lot, Estimated Completion in 2023 Impacted Schools: Beacon Hill Int'l School, Mercer Int'l Middle School, and Franklin High School

SCIDpda is developing a mixed-use community development that is projected to begin construction in 2021. The development will include 160 units of affordable, family-sized housing. The new development is expected to include about 85 two or more bedroom units. More information can be found on the SCIDpda website.
