


Q1: What grade level(s) do you work with?





Q7: What kind of formal training have you had to teach the curriculum above?
















Q15: Have you received Title IX training from the District?


Q16: How much did the training you received from the District regarding Title IX improve your knowledge of the ways to...

Q17: What style of training would you prefer? (Please rank from 1 to 5)










Q21: Do you know who your Title IX school compliance official is?


Q22: Do you know who the Title IX Officer for the District is?

Q23: Have you read Superintendent Procedure 3208SP regarding sexual harassment and sexual assault?




