RELEASE OF RESPONSIBILITY  
2021-2022**

It is Seattle Public Schools policy that special education students on curb-to-curb service be received by a responsible adult at the time of drop off. In the event no one is available to receive the student and attempts to contact the parent/guardian and all emergency contacts fail, the student will be taken to the nearest police precinct. The driver will leave a note on the door advising the parent/guardian to call 911. The parent/guardian will be responsible for picking up his/her student.

If the parent/guardian is assured the student can attend to his/her own needs and may be dropped-off without a responsible person in attendance, then this form should be filled out, signed and returned to the Seattle Public Schools Transportation Department.
