- 4) Click **Complete the StrengthsExplorer Assessment**.
- 5) Click **Take Assessment**.
- 6) Read the notice.
- 7) Check all 3 boxes.
- 8) Click **I GOT IT**.
- 9) Take the assessment.
- 10) Read through your results.
