Mr. Del Valle reviewed the budget BTA IV spending has ended. The BEX V has some projects that will be spent and likely will not have additional funds available. No changes on the general fund. The E-rate update is 4.3M, once Mr. Del Valle receives the official letter he will report back to the committee.

#### **1. Informational/Q&A: BTA V Levy (Carlos) 4:40 p.m.**

Mr. Del Valle provided the current levies update and spoke about the levy meetings he has been presenting at with community and PTSA groups. He reviewed how the levy rates are developed and updated every three years.

2. *Informational/Q&A: **Implicit Bias Training (REA) 5:00 p.m.***

Dr. Conrad Webster from the Department of Racial Equity and Advancement explained how implicit bias attitudes and stereotypes affect our understandings and actions, and decision makings in an unconscious manner. Dr. Webster reviewed additional trainings that can be done with the ITAC committee. Dr. Webster spoke about how implicit bias can be found in technology and what experiences he was able to relate to Seattle Public Schools (SPS).

3. *Informational/Q&A: **Measuring User Experience (Rafael G.) 5:25 p.m.***

Rafael spoke about how digital tools for student learning and family engagement is important. He reviewed the ways the digital learning department works within SPS. He spoke about how schools with highest needs are identified and how technology is implemented. He explained this year 18 schools are participating within the professional development cohorts that his department oversees. He explained the process each cohort participant goes through while in the program. The goal is to have technology help students and educators and become more independent in their learning.

4. *Informational/Q&A: **Software Approval (Craig B.) 5:45 p.m.***

Craig gave a question for the open comment discussion. What is the process or controls to address conflicting software or site access, example YouTube? Mr. Del Valle explained the process that goes into a software approval. He explained the educational and technology steps within the process. A working group will begin next week to further investigate software approval.
