RCW Requirement to Post Data Related to Low Income High School Student Participation in Extracurricular Activities

Pursuant to the enactment of 3SHB 1660 revising RCW 28A.325.050, school districts must collect, calculate, and report the following to OSPI and make the information available on each school's website:

- Data related to students in possession of an ASB card and student participation in school-based athletic programs/activities for each high school containing grades 9 thru 12.
- Calculate whether an "opportunity gap" exists for each school. The "opportunity gap" in athletic program participation is the difference between the percentage of high school students who are low income, possess an associated body card and participate in an athletic program from the percentage of students who are not low income, possess an associated student body card and participate in an athletic program.

Seattle Public Schools' extra-curricular athletic programs and activities are a component of students' Associated Student Body activities.

The posted data provided in this publishing is unaudited and ensures Seattle Public School's compliance with RCW 28A.325.050 and is not representative of a school's full fiscal year athletic activities and programs.
