Escalation

Budgets are set for BTA Levy projects based on a Master Plan and some reasonable assumptions around scope & systems; the amount of change in construction costs can be difficult to predict; that change is referred to as <u>escalation</u>

Lifecycle Costs

Operational costs take away from dollars for teaching & learning - so we always strive to reduce the Cost of Ownership by looking at long-lasting, easily maintainable materials & energy-efficient systems. Classrooms: -Lots of windows - Better ceilings
