One is how schools are resourced, which relates directly to WSS work. The resolution also addresses other



			items including repayment of Rainy-Day fund, utilization of financing arrangements (potentially a loan) to defer school closures.
2:20	● Rounding for Elementary Schools	Linda S. / Pat R.	Background: WSS model currently rounds up to next 1.0 in all scenarios. Intent is to increase transparency. The proposed change would be cost neutral, it should not reduce nor increase the total number of teaching FTE across the district.  • Two scenarios presented. (Spreadsheet attached)  • Scenario 1: Within total allocation, K-3 teachers rounded up or down to 1.0; Within total allocation, 4-5 teachers remaining balance.  • Scenario 2: Within total allocation, K-3 teachers rounded to nearest 0.5; Within total allocation, 4-5 teachers remaining balance.  • Concern that this would generate more split classes. Discussion about how splits are often caused by having small schools.  • Group agreed they needed more time to process options.  • Group stressed community concern about reconfiguring in October; splits are not ideal; prefer larger classes in 4-5 rather than splits.
2:40	K-3 Changes Discussion	Dr. Torres	<ul> <li>Discussion points were as follows:</li> <li>Challenges with reconfiguring classes into the school year was a problem.</li> <li>Numbers pretty solid in August. Usually not major shifts after that. Meet with REDs and make adjustments then.</li> <li>Have a way to tell Principals to wait to hire until we have data on how many kids will be in which schools.</li> <li>Suggestion for District to ask families to provide information if they are leaving district or leaving school.</li> <li>Need to get better information to new principals.</li> <li>REDs meet with ES to go over their configurations at SLI.</li> <li>Suggestion for June and August reviews.</li> <li>Conversation will continue in January.</li> </ul>
