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
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










## Overview of Results 2022-23



Immediate risks include indication of suicidal ideation, suicide attempt, self-harm, or safety at risk. Moderate risks include indication of bullying or harassment, symptoms of anxiety or depression, signs of substance use, abuse, or intent to use, body image/eating habit concerns, isolation from school adults, and relationship concerns.




### Student-Reported Risk Behaviors (# of students)

Symptoms of anxiety Bullying or harassment Symptoms of depression Feels angry, sad, worried often Substance use Self-harm Suicidal ideation Isolation from school adults Eating habit concerns Intent to use substances Suicide attempt Relationship concerns Problem substance use Safety at risk

Students who reported suicidal ideation (n= 180) also frequently reported symptoms of depression (67%), symptoms of anxiety (68%), self-harm behaviors (57%), and bullying or harassment (56%). They also had a higher rate of substance use than the general population (29% of students with suicidal ideation as compared to 8% of the general population). The SBIRT program helps to identify these concerns early, when they can be addressed with minimal disruption to the learning environment, and before larger issues develop.

## SBIRT Outcomes 2022-23


Check Yourself identified new concerns, previously unknown to school staff, for 714 students in 2022-23 (55% of students screened)

**417** students were connected to services through SBIRT in 2022-23 (Not all students with concerns were referred to services)











## **STUDENT CONNECTION TO SCHOOL ADULTS**

Students naturally connect to adults at school more as the schoolyear progresses. However, students who received an SBIRT brief intervention meeting during the schoolyear reported a higher increase in connection than the general student population. SBIRT students' increase was 23%, as opposed to the 14% increase for all other students.
