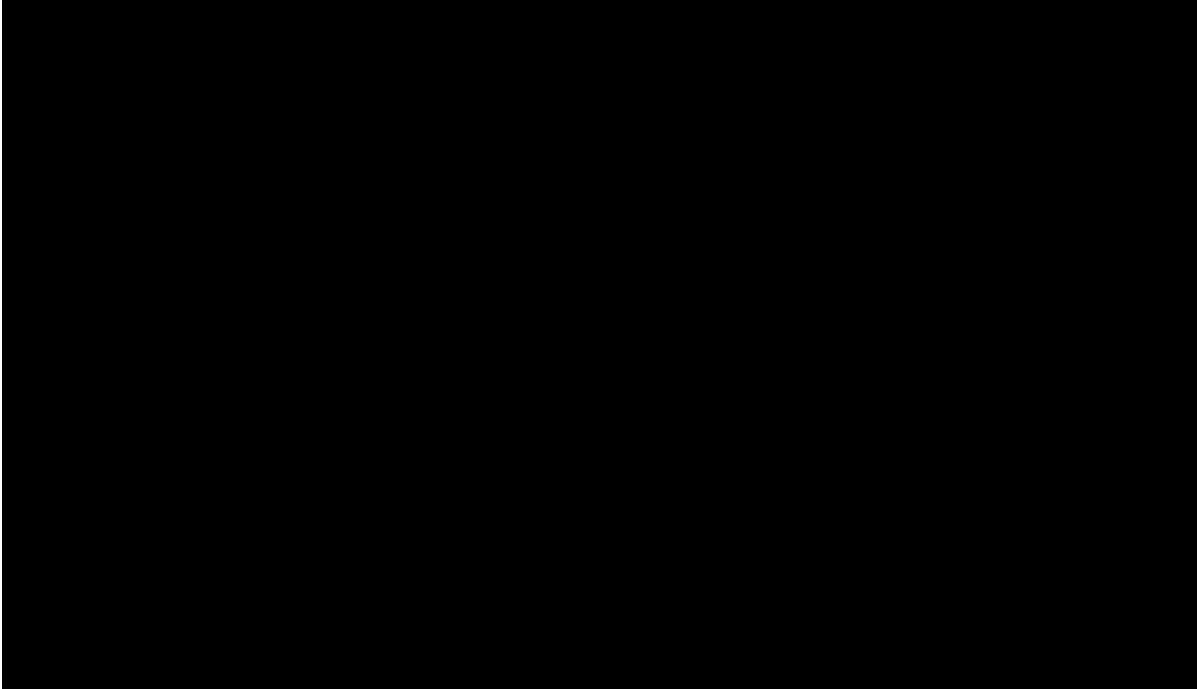


Do Now

WA Laws on Sexting

Washington's child pornography laws prohibit possessing, sending and receiving of nude or sexually suggestive images of a minor (a person under 18). This includes sexting between two minors. These laws apply to adults and minors who send, receive or possess images of minors. A minor can commit an offense by sexting a selfie sending an image of another minor, or even simply having these types of images saved on their phone.

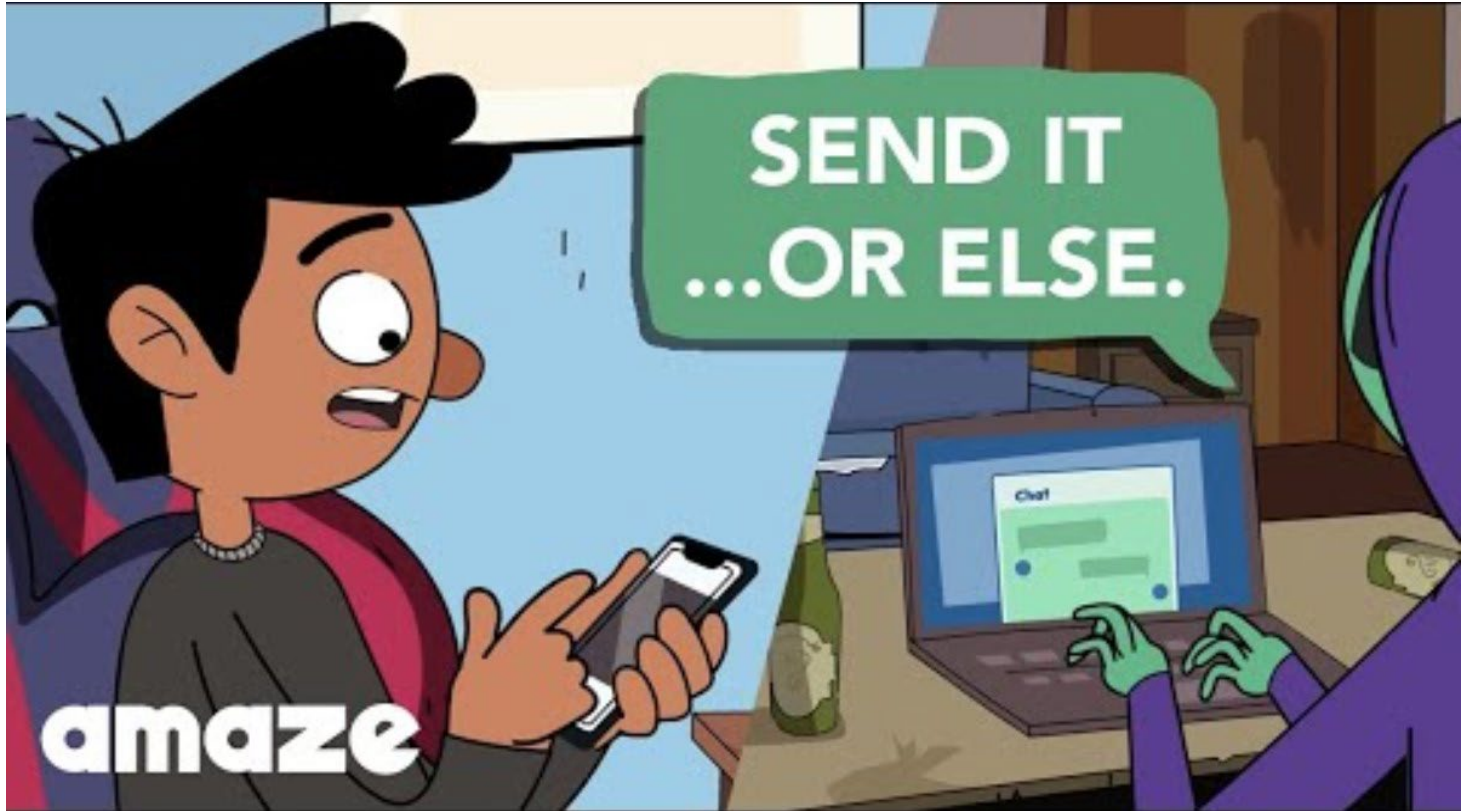

Tech in Relationships: Healthy or Not?

Tech in Relationships: Wrap Up

- Any sharing of nude or revealing pictures carries safety risks as well as possible legal consequences.
- Using technology to bully, shame or embarrass someone is cyberbullying, and can also be considered sexual harassment.
- Using technology to control or harm a romantic partner is a form of relationship abuse.
