Why Do Students Need a Field?

• Benefits of an accessible field

- Supports physical education & sports for boys & girls:
 - Football, soccer, cheer, marching band
- Community and school events
- Safe and convenient outdoor space for students
- Current limitations without a dedicated field space
 - Transportation cost
 - Scheduling / access displacement of current use
 - Travel time hours spent on buses

Exploration and Evaluation



- Criteria for field selection:
 - Proximity to the school
 - Accessibility and safety
 - Size and amenities
 - Impact on community and neighborhood

Field Options Considered and Not Selected

- 1. Meridian Playfield Landmark Status, Parking, Recent Renovations, Community / Current Use Displacement
- 2. Lower Woodland #7 Field Current Use Displacement
- 3. Lower Woodland #2 Current Use Displacement
- 4. Big Howe Proximity, Current Use Displacement
- 5. Interbay Playfield Proximity, Current Use Displacement, Complex Stakeholder Makeup
- 6. Montlake Playfield Proximity, Current Use Displacement
- 7. Roger's Playfield Proximity, Current Use Displacement, Not Large Enough to Accommodate Need
- 8. Robert Eagle Staff Middle School Proximity, Current Use Displacement
- 9. University Playfield Not Large Enough to Accommodate Need
- 10. BF Day Park Current Use Displacement, Not Large Enough to Accommodate Need
- 11. Gasworks Park Landmark Status City and Federal, Proximity, Site Constraints, Size
- 12. Lincoln HS North Parking Lot Current Use Displacement, Not Large Enough to Accommodate Need
- 13. Woodland Park Parking Lot @ 50th & Aurora Current Use Displacement, Complex Stakeholder Makeup
- 14. Queen Anne Bowl Proximity, Parking, Current Use Displacement, Unique Neighbor / Residence Proximity

Consideration of Alternatives

Gasworks Park

- City Landmark In the National Registry
- Distance 1.1 mile & Site Complexities



Lincoln HS North Parking Lot

- Not Large enough space for even a half-size field
- Parking req'd for City permitting / MUP



What We've Heard

Full-Size Field at Wallingford Playfield

- September 19 Community Meeting #1: 100–150 attendees, 147 comment cards collected.
- Additional Feedback Sources: 600+ messages in emails, SPS portal (Let's Talk), Nextdoor, Wallyhood blog, petitions, Facebook (partial sample).
- Sentiment Analysis:
 - Opposed: 45%
 - Supportive: 30%
 - Neutral: 25%

Top Concerns

- Community access
- Loss of green space
- Lighting

Top Support

- Proximity
- Improved conditions
- Community athletics

Wallingford Playfield

New Proposal Recommendation

Track & Field at Lower Woodland #7

- None of the evaluated locations can accommodate both a field and track.
- We're proposing upgrading existing track at Lower Woodland #7, also a Seattle Parks property.
- We're also exploring field event space in the unutilized area immediately adjacent to field #7.

Half-Size Field at Wallingford Playfield

- **Proximity** to Lincoln High School and Hamilton International Middle School.
- Benefits Hamilton students accessibility for nearly 3,000 students annually.
- Retains character of the Park and provides community benefits, including youth sports clubs and activities for public use.

Full-Size Field at Woodland Park

- Proximity to Lincoln and Hamilton, within walking distance half-mile.
- Community benefits: youth sports clubs and broader public use.
- Potential to activate an under-utilized space.


Lower Woodland Field #7: Track & Field Only
