Executive Summary of Enrollment Trends for Seattle Public Schools (SPS)

Seattle Public Schools Historical Annual Enrollment (2011-12 to 2024-25)



- Enrollment in SPS showed growth year over year until the 2018-19 school year (Figure 1, Table 1).
- Since the onset of the pandemic in the spring of 2020, however, enrollment has declined by over 4,000 students.
- In the 2024-25 school year, SPS saw an increase of fourteen students from the previous year.

Indicators of Change

Decreasing Births and Lower Kindergarten Enrollment

- The projection of future kindergarten enrollment is determined using two factors:
 - 1. births in the Seattle area and,
 - 2. the percentage of children born in Seattle who enroll in SPS five years later.
- Demographic data on births from the years 2006-07 to 2016-17 showed an increase in births with the highest point in 2016-17 at 7,563 births (Table 2).
- The percentage of students born in Seattle that enroll in kindergarten has, however, steadily declined from a peak of 72% in the 2012-13 school year (Table 2).
- The 2024-25 school year saw 53.5% of children born in 2019-20 enroll in kindergarten (Table 2).



- Lifetime/entire cohort retention rate is determined by the number of enrolling Kindergarteners and year over year cohort retention rate.
- Total lifetime/entire cohort retention rate comparing those enrolled in Kindergarten in 2012-13 to those seniors in 2024-25 is 79.82% (Table 3).
- The number of seniors comparing to the enrolling kindergarteners of the same year is lower for all the years, except for 2023-24 and 2024-25 (Table 3, Figure 3). For these two school years, the number of seniors outweighs the entering Kindergarteners.
- It is anticipated that future kindergarten classes will likely be smaller than graduating seniors and this proves the year over year declining trend.



- Progression rate of complete cohort of the same year is also varying (Table 4). Comparing to other school years,
 the grade progression rate of 2021-22 to 2022-23 of all grades was the highest (Table 4).
- Grade progression to jump from elementary to middle school (5-6) rates have the lowest progression rate throughout all years covered in the report (Table 4).
- Opposite to the 5-6 cohort grades, 11-12 is the cohort with highest progression rate in almost all the years. This may be a result of delayed graduation/re-enrolling of credit deficient seniors to graduate (Table 4).

- Demographic composition Overall, SPS enrollment over the past 20 years has gradually increased its share of white students and consequentially decreased the overall minority enrollment.
- The only group of students of color to increase is Hispanic and Multi-racial students. Native American, Asian,
 Pacific Islander, and Black student populations have declined as a percentage of total enrollment.
