

## TRANSPORTATION RELEASE OF RESPONSIBILITY 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR

It is Seattle Public Schools policy that special education students on curb-to-curb service be received by a responsible adult at the time of drop off. In the event no one is available to receive the student and attempts to contact the parent/guardian and all emergency contacts fail, the student will be taken to the nearest police precinct. The driver will leave a note on the door advising the parent/guardian to call 911. The parent/guardian will be responsible for picking up their student.

If the parent/guardian is sure that the student can attend to their own needs and may be dropped off without a responsible person in attendance, then this form should be filled out, signed and returned to the Seattle Public Schools Transportation Department.
