

Career Fairs - Attend local fairs and meet organizations and businesses for potential hirings and networking		<b>Service Learning</b> - This is a great opportunity to showcase your passions and skills outside of the classroom
Career Lists - Make a list of careers that may interest you and research the education level required for each profession		Informational Interview - Network with professionals on their education and/or career path. Learn from their experiences
<b>Extracurriculars</b> - Enhance skills that would be useful in a career of interests by joining a club, sport, getting a job, or volunteering		<b>Personal Statements</b> - As you're drafting your essay, it's important to have others read it to give perspective. Have at least 2 readers
